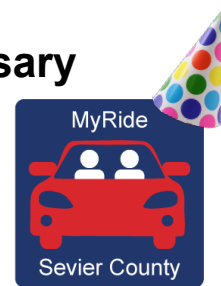


## MyRide Sevier County celebrates one year anniversary

grocery stores and pharmacies.**



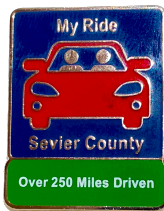

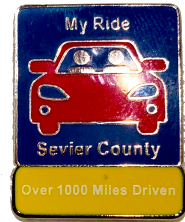

\*MyRide Sevier County is designed to provide Sevier County seniors, 60 years and older, with much needed transportation. Rides to doctor appointments, pharmacies or grocery stores can help them maintain their independence, enabling them to lead a healthier, more productive life and therefore a happier one. It is a volunteer-based service that utilizes advanced internet software to schedule, track, maintain and manage common destinations and repeat riders. Volunteers are provided internet access to all scheduled riders and the ability to choose a convenient time. Volunteer drivers can even schedule to have a senior's ride coincide with one they were already planning for themselves. The ease and flexibility of the program make it a great fit for both senior citizen riders and volunteer drivers alike.

## Here are **6 ways** to safely make this difficult time for seniors a little less lonely and isolated:

**Volunteer to write a note or call a senior who is alone and talk for a few minutes.**

**Volunteer to make a hot meal and deliver for a homebound senior.**

**Volunteer to make and deliver a *We Care* package to a homebound senior.

**Volunteer to pick up groceries or prescriptions for a homebound senior.**

**Volunteer to drive seniors with no transportation to essential appointments.**
